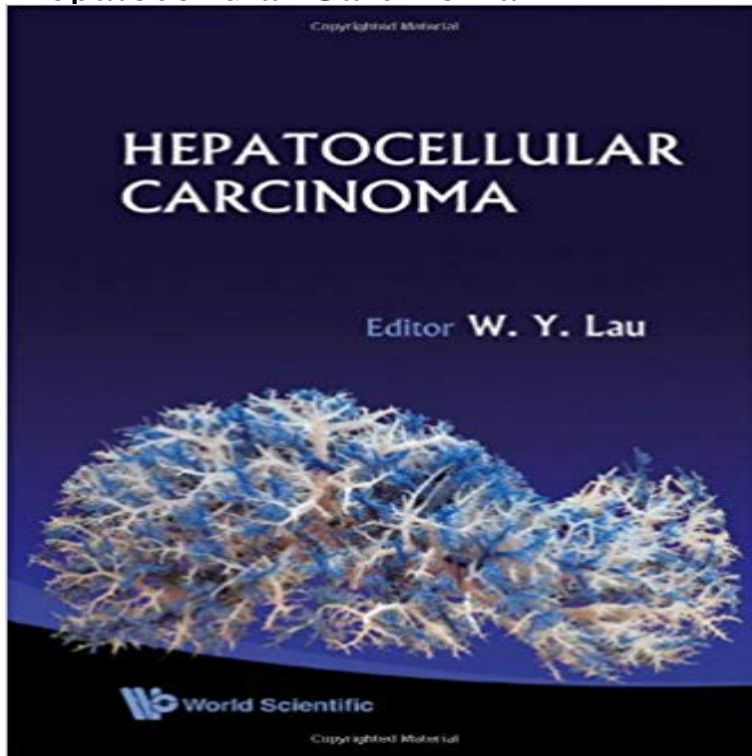


# Hepatocellular Carcinoma
