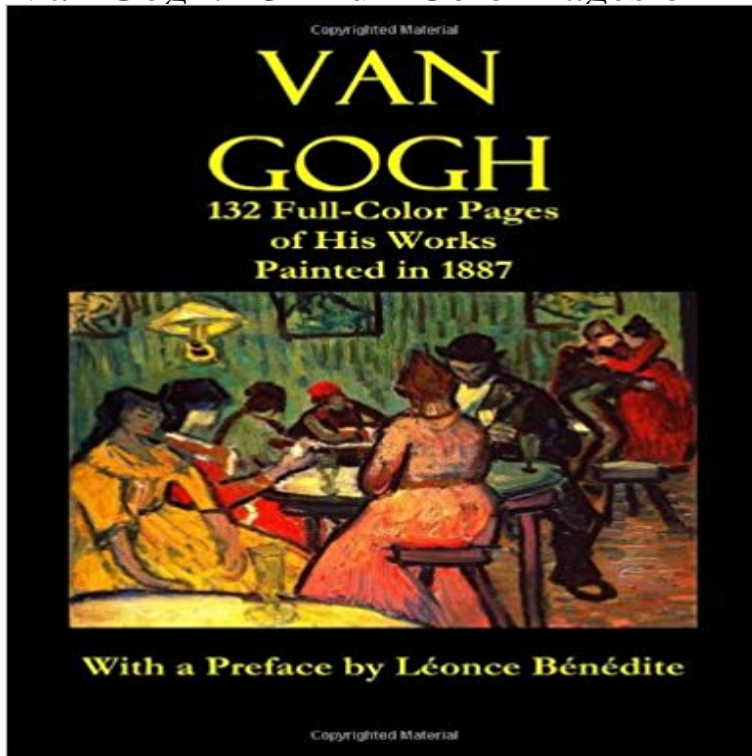


Van Gogh: 132 Full-Color Pages of His Works Painted in 1887



We have now come to one of the strangest and most disputed personalities of modern art, not only as regards Holland, but also as regards France, for he belongs as much to the French school as to that of his native country. This is Vincent Van Gogh. When we put his pictures next to those of his younger fellow-painters, whom we have just been considering, we at once understand the influence he had over them and that general tendency in the young Dutch school towards striking effects of light and bright colours. Pure tone reigns supreme in his pictures, and the poor Vincent (in France he signed all his works with his Christian name only) died a victim to that excessive sensibility of his visual sense, which caused him to pursue until the very end, in the terrors of impotence, the chimera of not only interpreting and transposing the only thing it is possible for mere man to do but of reproducing and fixing the splendours and the phantasmagoria of nature with the poor, stunted, material means of a painter's palette. Vincent van Gogh was born at Groot-Zundert (Dutch Brabant) on the 30th of March, 1853, and he died in France, at Auvers-sur-Oise, on the 29th of July, 1890. He was the son of a Protestant pastor, who wanted him to be a merchant. As soon as he was old enough, therefore, to choose a profession, he entered the office of his uncle Van Gogh, an art dealer, connected with the Paris house of Goupil. He stayed there until 1876, when he went to London, with the object of devoting himself, with a kind of apostolic faith which showed his generous, exalted character, to the teaching of the people in the workmen's quarters. Following the general custom, he preached in the streets. The year after he returned to Amsterdam, intending to study theology there and preach to the colliers. At this time he seems to have begun to draw. In 1880 he was living with his father at Etten, devoting himself to art with the same

ardent faith with which he had first given himself to religious things. He studied for some time at The Hague, where he was influenced by Mauve, went to Antwerp in 1885, and after that to Paris. There he worked for some time and was strongly influenced by the impressionistic and the neo-impressionistic painters, although his favourite masters were Rembrandt, Delacroix and Millet, some of whose pictures he copied. In the spring of 1886 he went to Provence, that bright and light Provence of the banks of the Rhone, and lived first at Arles, then at St. Remy, and then at Saintes-Maries. He worked there with the passionate ardour with which he did everything he undertook, and so injured himself with the sad pursuit of his unattainable ideal, that, ill and discouraged, he returned to Paris, settled at Auvers-sur-Oise in May, 1890, dying suddenly three months after. Van Gogh's work shows two distinct manners: his Dutch manner, in the style of the old masters, where he strove, as he said himself, to render light in shade; his French manner, in which we notice the influences, blended, or rather in juxtaposition, first of Courbet, Millet, Delacroix, and then of Corot and the different impressionist masters: Sisley or Pissarro, Renoir or Cezanne, nay even Toulouse-Lautrec and Gauguin; but soon he disengaged himself in order to create that personal, exalted, almost frenzied vision, in which he added to the wildest expressive exaggerations of design, violent but agreeable harmonies and sometimes very delicate and subtle tones.
