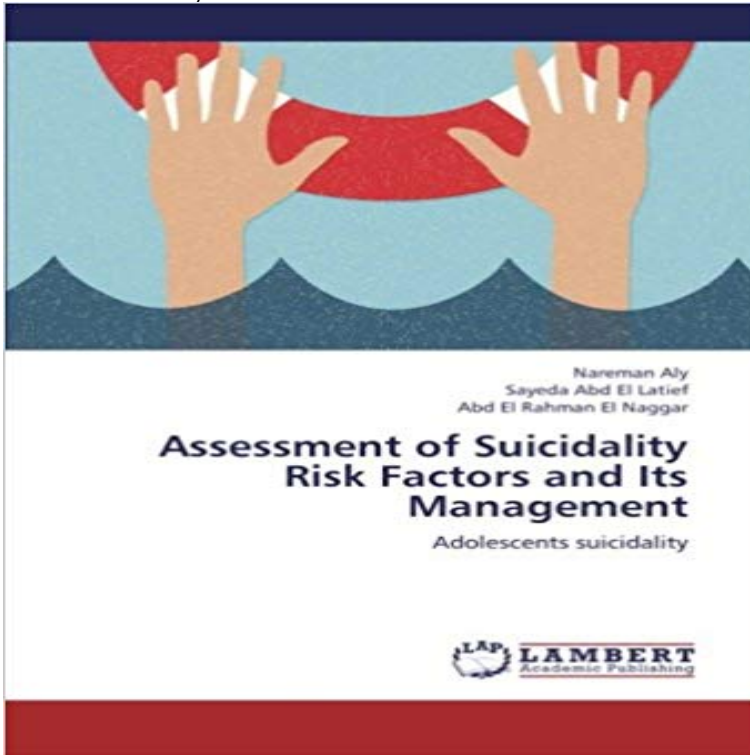


Assessment of Suicidality Risk Factors and Its Management: Adolescents suicidality
